

KENTUCKY STATE LAW-Bryan's Law KRS 507.020 _An act relating to crimes and punishments and naming the statute "Bryan's Law."

Relating to manslaughter in the second degree when a person wantonly causes the death of another through the operation of a motor vehicle or the death of a child leaving that child in a motor vehicle to specify that leaving a child under 8 years of age in a motor vehicle without an attendant at least 16 years of age may constitute manslaughter in the second degree; Amend KRS 508.010 relating to assault in the first degree to specify that leaving a child under 8 years of age in motor vehicle without an attendant at least 16 years of age may constitute assault in the first degree if the child suffers physical serious injury as a result thereof; Amend KRS 508.060 relating to wanton endangerment in the first degree to specify that leaving a person with a physical or mental disability precluding taking self protected actions or leaving a child under 8 years of age in a motor vehicle without an attendant at least 16 years of age may be wanton endangerment in the first degree.
